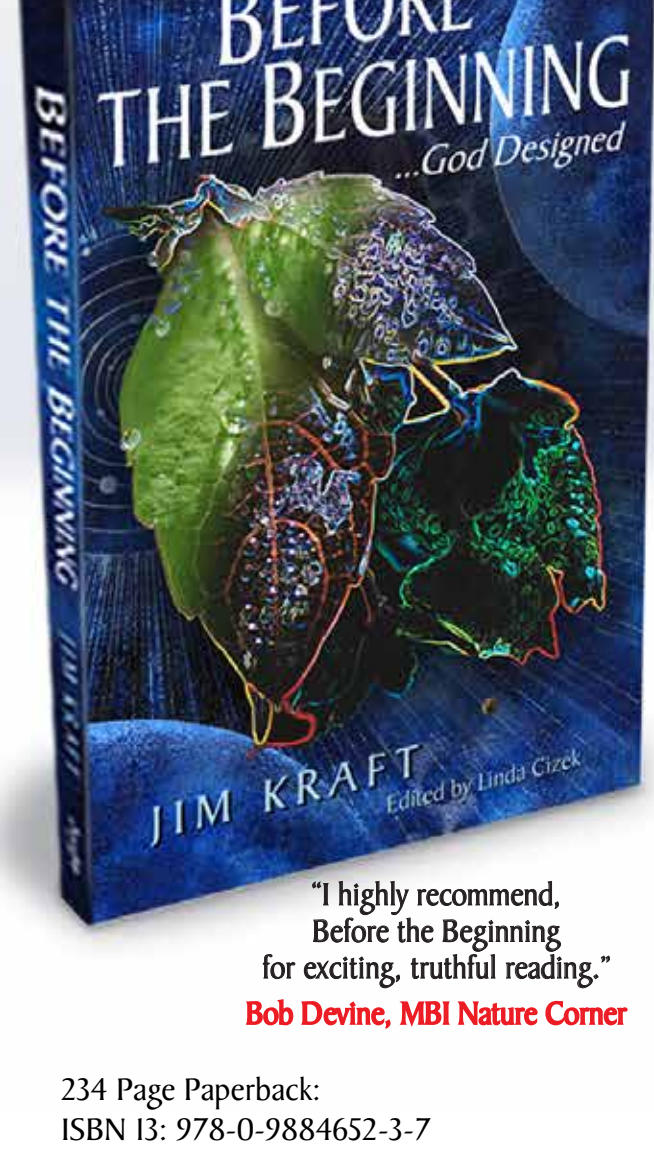




Got Awe?

When we journey back to the beginning something extraordinary – almost unexplainable – begins to happen, and that changes everything.

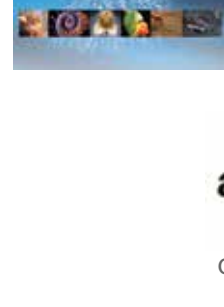

According to Bob's family, he didn't wrestle with God in his journey, Bob "walked" with God all the way!

The strong, steady and cheerful example Bob gave us will never be forgotten. The creativity and passion that Bob found in the design of creation was certainly an inspiration for my book. 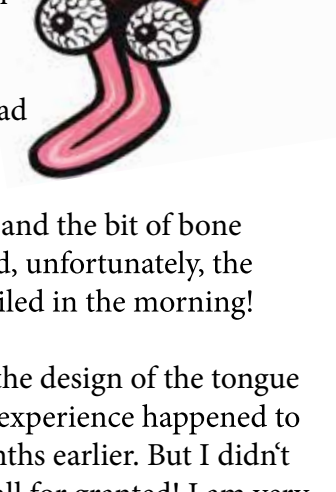
Bursts of Glory—The flower

The tongue;

- Flavor sensor and sifter! You know about the taste buds —some for sweet, some for salty —but the idea of the tongue as a sifter?! That really smacked me in the face when we got ice cream the other day. I am sure it was a "deja vu" moment (I do love ice cream), but this time I got the message.



Same place, same product, but a different day. As 'Stacy' took a lick of her "crunchy dipped ice cream" she felt something harder than normal. We all have been there! Ugh! the prospect of a chipped tooth is on the horizon. But instinctively, the tongue begins to exercise its' wiggling and sifting behavior. Like panning for gold, but instead of visual inspection, the tongue identifies the tiny piece of hard matter through determined focus and the sense of touch, and the bit of bone quickly emerges—sifted from all else! And, unfortunately, the worst is confirmed! The dentist will be hailed in the morning!

It was neat to hear my wife acknowledge the design of the tongue to be able to do such a feat! The identical experience happened to me at the same ice cream stand a few months earlier. But I didn't acknowledge the designer—I just took it all for granted! I am very proud of my wife for recognizing that if there is a design, there is a Designer!

When our ancestors figured out that the earth wasn't flat, they changed what they taught. I believe that the world and all that is in it was created by God, therefore evolution is foolishness and disproves itself. If we are so highly evolved, how is it we do not see the utter impossibility that we evolved from a puddle of goo?

Out of the box thinking would include: What application is best for this particular material? Where has the heavy weight of traditional metal been unusable in the past—or what situations would improve when fabric gives out? Is this an element for flight, personal safety apparel, and maybe even creepy nano robotics???

This is a very small, finite example of the mental gymnastics man can go through in the design thinking process. Our infinite God had to think through not only material usability but material and element creation, strength, compatibility with other materials, mankind helps in pre and post "the fall of man" conditions. (Environment and physical conditions changed with the fall. E.g.: From no pain to pain in child birth) —and the list goes on! He indeed is an awesome God!

Applications of artificial spider silk could include using it for artificial ligaments and tendons due to its elastic tendencies. The bio web is a natural product which will synthesize well with the body. Other applications include the creation of bulletproof vests which could possibly be thinner, yet stronger, than Kevlar vests, improved vehicle airbags and stronger, more reliable parachutes.

After Jesus performed some of these miracles, He stated, "You will do even greater works than these." I can't help but to wonder was Jesus referring to man's discovery and invention types of works?
